Hopefully you received an email from Mr Byrne, on Wednesday 27th May 2020, outlining the school's proposal to connect with the children via video link and Zoom. If you missed this letter it can be found on the school website under the Parents' Tab and Covid-19

In the interest of safeguarding, we ask that you remain in the room during these calls. We are all excited about this new way of communicating with the children and are keeping our fingers crossed that the technology works and all runs smoothly.

Our school governors met virtually on Thursday 28th May 2020 to discuss our 'Return to School Action Plan' and an associated 'Risk Assessment.' These will be made public on the school website under the Parents' Tab and Covid-19 www.willowstimperley.co.uk on Monday, as the Prime Minister has confirmed that all schools may reopen from 1st June 2020.

On Monday 1st June, I will be emailing parents of key workers and children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 who have requested a place for their children back at school. This will give details of return to school arrangements and outline how we propose to keep the whole school community safe. This is a long letter but it is very important that it is read carefully. We will continue to wait to hear from the government about the possible return of other year groups. As I keep saying I don't know any more than you, but will keep you informed and updated of any developments when we receive them.
