

# PATCH WORK CUSHION COVERS

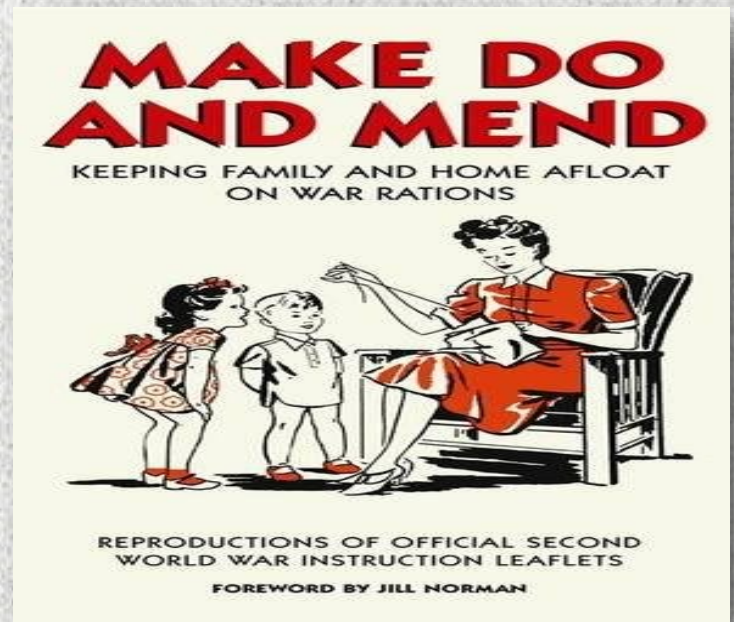
Curriculum Subject - DT

## Summary

To compliment the UKS2 Theme of WWII we 'will make do and mend' using scraps of materials to create a cushion covers.

We will develop a knowledge of a variety of different textiles and consider how to combine these using running stitch and overstretch.

While doing this we will develop fine motor skills and evaluate how well synthetic and natural materials combine.



## Key Vocabulary

1. **Material Sources**– textile material can be either natural or synthetic
2. **Synthetic Material**– a material that is man made.
3. **Natural Material**– a material which is from a natural source
4. **Running stitch**– is the primary stitch used for darning.
5. **Overstretch**– this is sometimes called whipstitch and wraps the working thread around the edge of fabric or seams.
6. **Tacking**– is a temporary way to hold a seam before you sew it.

## Top Facts

1. Synthetic material include: nylon, polyester, lycra
2. Natural materials include: wool, cotton, silk,
3. During WWII materials were rationed so people had to rely on the good which they already owned.
4. When combining textiles different types of stitches are used for different purposes.
